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5. Is **Section 5 Assessing proposals** helpful to officers and elected members in understanding the need to give due weight to the historic environment and design issues when making decisions on tall buildings applications as part of delivering sustainable growth.

To avoid confusion in the way in which the guidance is to be applied by planning decision takers, it would be useful to make it clear that the criteria for assessment of tall buildings are matters which determine whether a proposal is acceptable to the Design Council and EH. Such a qualification was included in paragraph 4.4 of the July EH/CABE document but is absent from the analogous paragraph (5.9) in the consultation document.

A planning decision taker will of course need to base a planning decision on a balance of considerations. This will of course include the guidance, but will also

include the development plan and the NPPF itself, and in particular the latter's "presumption in favour of sustainable development".
